What do I need to register?

→ Passport photo

Note: the photo should be recent and without a border, and the dimensions should be 45 mm (height) by 35 mm (width)

- → Identity card, passport, alternative form of ID or replacement identity card
- → Confirmation of attendance of a health consultation within the last three months, pursuant to Section 10 Para. 1 of the Prostitute Protection Act (ProstSchG) GESAH 14 Health and Consumer Protection Authority, Tel.: +49 (0)40 428 37 41 20
- → A current registration confirmation is available from the customer centre in any of the offices in the Hamburg district.

Note on the delivery address: A delivery address is only accepted for homeless people or foreign nationals. A form which you can use to confirm your delivery address when registering can be found at **www.hamburg.de/prostitution**.

Note for non-EU nationals: You must provide documentation proving that you have permission to work, or to be self-employed, in Germany.


What personal information is collected during registration?

- → Given name and surname
- Date and place of birth
- → Nationality
- → Sole or main residence within the meaning of the registration law, alternatively a delivery address and
- → The name(s) of the Federal State(s) or municipality(-ies) in which you work or intend to work.

The Prostitute Protection Act (ProstSchG)

As of 1 July 2017, all persons employed as sex workers (male, female and transgender prostitutes) must be registered.

Sex workers (male, female and transgender prostitutes) are obligated to obtain a confirmation of registration, so that they can work as prostitutes. It is also possible to obtain an alias certificate, bearing your self-chosen pseudonym (e.g. work name) during registration.

The Altona District Office in Hamburg is responsible for registering prostitutes pursuant to the Prostitute Protection Act (ProstSchG).

The **FA-BEA* Pro** department is responsible for three tasks: Providing prostitutes with information and advice, granting licences for prostitution work (premises, practice, agencies and vehicles in Hamburg), and monitoring and controlling all areas.
